INTRODUCTORY RITES

RITE OF SPRINKLING WITH HOLY WATER

The priest sprinkles himself, his ministers and the people with holy water to remind us of our Baptism in which we were joined to the dying and rising of Christ, our sins were washed away, and we became part of his priestly people.

Antiphon: I beheld water issuing out of the right side of the temple, alleluia: and all to whom the waters came were saved, and they shall say: alleluia, alleluia. Ps.118. O give thanks unto the Lord for he is gracious: because his mercy endureth for ever. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. The Antiphon is repeated.

Priest: O Lord, shew thy mercy upon us.

*People: **And grant us thy salvation.***

Priest: O Lord, hear my prayer.

*People: **And let my cry come unto thee.***

Priest: The Lord be with you.

*People: **And with thy Spirit.***

Priest: Let us pray. Graciously hear us, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God: and vouchsafe to send thy Holy Angel from heaven; to guard, cherish, protect, visit, and defend all who dwell in this holy place. Through Christ our Lord.

*All: **Amen.***

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord and Giver of Life, Who proceedeth from the Father and the Son; Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; Who spake by the prophets: And I believe one Catholic and Apostolic Church: I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins: And I look for the Resurrection of the dead: And the life of the world to come. People: **Amen.**

PREPARATION OF THE COMMUNICANTS

The people are asked to make this Confession of their sins. Then:

All: **Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Maker of all things, Judge of all men: We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, Which we, from time to time, most grievously have committed, By thought, word, and deed, Against thy Divine Majesty, provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; The remembrance of them is grievous unto us; The burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, Have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; For thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, Forgive us all that is past; And grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, To the honour and glory of thy name; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

The Prayer of Humble access is omitted during Eastertide

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Priest: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: **It is meet and right so to do.**

The priest continues with the PREFACE, after which the Choir sings:

Glory be to thee, O Lord Most High.
Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

During the Eucharistic Prayer the bread and wine become our Lord's Body and Blood; we are then offered to the Father in union with the perfect sacrifice of Jesus.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Priest: Behold the Lamb of God;
